

Placement & Recruitment

Students have the opportunity to take the **Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) Student** certification exams in one or more of 9 areas to help further solidify their career path.

Graduates of the Vocational Automotive Technology Program attaining some ASE Student certification have been actively recruited by automotive groups and the armed forces, as well as **NASCAR**. Students graduate with workforce ready skills.

The skills learned during the two-year program provide students with a strong foundation for continuing education as well. Most graduates go on to traditional two-year and four-year colleges or advanced technical colleges; others enter the workforce.

SCILL works with regional universities, businesses, and recruiters to help students qualify for scholarships and receive additional training upon graduation. A dual credit agreement with **Ivy Tech** allows students to obtain college credit at no cost to the student.

SCILL Vocational AutomotiveTechnology Program

The SCILL Vocational Automotive Technology Program is a two-year, half-day program in which students from area high schools may elect to participate. Junior and Senior students attend their high school for half a day, participate in sports and extra-curricular activities, and spend the other half at SCILL.

program adheres The National to Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF) and Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) standards. Students learn the technical and mechanical skills necessary to adjust, repair, and overhaul automobiles and individual component systems, including theory, computerized diagnostics, and engine performance. Students leave SCILL with the ability to make decisions and solve problems, visualize components, and make precise adjustments. Through participation in several SCILL sponsored community service events, students learn the importance of being well-rounded citizens. Program participants are selected on their career objective, attendance record, ability to provide transportation to the program site, and recommendation from the student's guidance counselor.

SCILL is currently one of only two high school programs offered in the State of Indiana that are NATEF certified in all 8 of these areas of instruction:

- Brakes
- Electrical/Electronic Systems
- Engine Performance
- Suspension and Steering
- Automatic Transmission and Transaxle
- Engine Repair
- Heating and Air Conditioning
- Manual Drive Train and Axles
